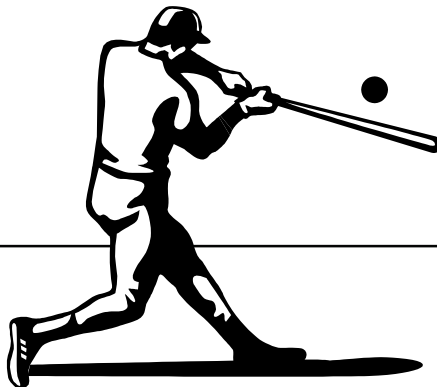

## FROM THE MANAGER'S DESK Gabriele Umbel, Manager

Life in the community has slowed down a lot in the past few weeks. The summer heat and frequent showers are keeping most activities to a much slower pace than we are used to during "the season". Actually, in the office, we are putting that extra time to good use. It is giving us a chance to catch up with some things we can't get to during the high energy winter activities. Things like cleaning out files and checking records, taking a look at home sites, sending reminders to clean up, trim, edge, re-sod, fertilize, etc, etc. are all getting more attention at this point.

Has everyone had a chance to use their "wooden nickel" yet? If you are wondering what they are, stop in and pick one up...it's good for a 10% discount at the restaurant or in the Proshop for merchandise...

Primecast has worked very diligently to resolve any lingering billing issues and I hope that things will run more smoothly from now on. If you have a billing problem and you have tried but were unsuccessful in resolving it yourself, let me know and I will be happy to assist. Thanks for your patience!!!

NOTE: If you are preparing your RV for a trip or have just returned, please notify the office before parking in the street. As of the beginning of June, you need a dated ID hanger for the RV.

There are a number of irrigation systems that run even while it rains...Please make the adjustments or replace your rain gauge so that the system can shut down automatically.

If you have open downspouts on your gutters, it is a good idea to check after heavy rains to make sure that nothing was washed out. The combination of one of our gully washers and 3 or 4 inch open downspouts can do a lot of damage. Downspout extensions need to stay on your own home-site. Underground drains are the preferred way of drainage on every home site. You may want to think about retro fitting your downspouts to protect the foundation or driveway that otherwise may be damaged over the long term.

FYI: The pools and decks are cleaned every day, inspected for insects at least once, usually multiple times a day and sprayed as appropriate with insecticide. May I remind all of you that if you bring food or sodas to the pools, you must clean up after yourself, taking left over food with you. Empty soda cans should go into the recycle bin.

Please do not call the gate with notice of visitors or deliveries. Precalls need to be in writing and dropped off into the mailbox by the gate. The guards' primary responsibility is to assist cars through the gate as quickly and efficiently as possible.

And finally something I haven't mentioned in

a while: We are grateful to all of you for the many bags, boxes and cans of food you contribute to the food bank collection each month. Life is more difficult than ever for a lot of families trying to make it in this economy. Your very generous donations each and every month are giving many of those families the food to make it for another month. Although the summer decline in population in this area causes donations to the food banks to drop off a lot, Water Oak residents continue to bring their "Bag, Box or Can of Food" to the office during the beginning of each month.

What some of you may not know is that WOVA (Water Oak Veterans Auxiliary) takes care of the coordination, pick up and delivery of the food donations. They also supplement donations with cash contributions as they see the need. What a wonderful job every one of the members of WOVA has been doing for many years!

The WOQ will be hosting the Saturday coffee in October, We will have many of our quilts there for you to see.

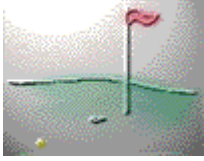

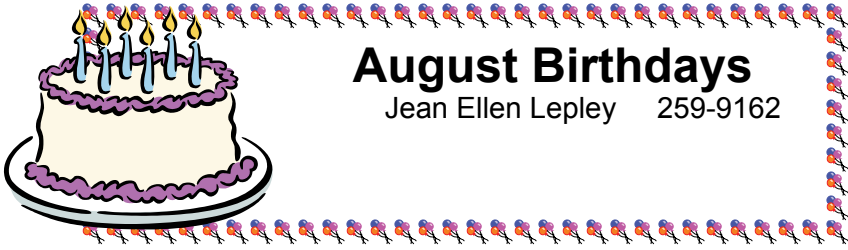
