"Tenderness," has a Les Miserables theme of a detective (Russell Crowe) chasing a psychopathic killer across upper New York State. I didn't get the connection between the title and the story. I found myself smiling through most of "Married Life," watching con man Iothario (Pierce Brosnan) manipulating situations to his advantage. "Dark Matter," starring Meryl Streep and Aidan Quinn claims to be a story based on certain events. I'm thinking the Virginia Tech massacre. It does give you an inside look into cultural differences and corruption in Academia. "Five Minutes of Heaven," starring Liam Neeson and James Neasbitt is a powerful story about gang warfare. Although it takes place in Ireland in the 70's it is very descriptive of what is going on with the violent gangs in this country today. I'm a fan of both Charlize Theron and Kim Basinger but "The Burning Plain," disappointed me. The characters seem very shallow. It's one of those movies your glad you didn't pay theater prices to see. "Unthinkable," starring Samuel L. Jackson is a thriller that looks at the torture dilemma now taking place in this country and is well worth seeing. Which side would you be on? "Fair Game," is about one woman maintaining a wild life sanctuary prevailing against three outback hunters trying to destroy her. Simple harassment turns deadly. "Charley Varrick," is a 1970's movie starring Walter Matthau as small time bank robber who stumbles on a large cache that belongs to the mob. The thrills abound as he tries to keep one step ahead of his pursuers in an attempt to keep the money. Thursday night's movie is "Wall Street: Money Never Sleeps." I hope to see you there.

much that it is a repeat every year.

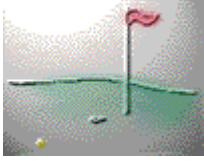
We are trying to drum up a bus trip to the Syracuse
