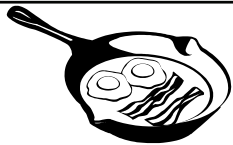

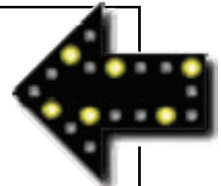

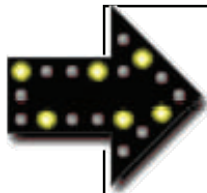

A note about the RV Storage area:

Remember that our monthly billing does not take into account credits or debits. Call to find out if your account is carrying a credit or debit.

Water Oak Walk-Abouts:

Some of you have seen Water Oak office and sales staff out in the community, knocking on doors and asking if we can do anything for you, whether you need assistance with Primecast or anything else. We'll continue to be out there once or twice a week until we have covered the community at least once, so if you have a good idea to share or a problem to solve, please don't hesitate to let us know. Did you know that you can add emergency notification information to your drivers license? If you were unable to speak to the EMS personnel, how would they know whom to contact or how to contact them? This information can be added to your drivers license by either going to the website below and adding it yourself or by visiting the Florida Drivers License Office and asking them to add it to your records. <https://www8.hsmv.state.fl.us/eci/>

In addition, if you carry a cell phone, you can simply add the ICE (In Case of Emergency) contact into your cell phone. Emergency personnel are trained to check for ICE numbers and will contact the designated person for you. My thanks to Chief Ed Nathanson for this very useful information!

be replaced. Much of it could perhaps be saved as long as the appropriate pre-emergent weed chemicals were applied earlier in the year. If you have bugs in the lawn you cannot identify, I am sure one of the garden center personnel can help you. Take a picture of the damage with you, as long as the picture shows both affected and unaffected area in the same shot, one of them will be able to assist you find the proper chemicals to eradicate the pets.

And finally, it is summer and many of our seasonal residents are gone, but the need for "A can, A bag or A box" of food for the food banks has not diminished. Water Oak residents have been very generous over the years, and I know that you will continue to support the food banks during the summer.

Water Oak Community Service Association- the optimum word is community. Instead of being a community- we have broken off into segments or clubs and I think have forgotten that the CSA was formed to be the umbrella over the community. People tell me-"I volunteered 20 years ago- I'm too tired now." Well the fact of the matter is that running 12 potlucks, 12 coffees and 12 movies a year would utilize 360 volunteers approximately one to two hours a YEAR. This way the same 10 people wouldn't be burned out! You can not run programs when you don't get the PARTICIPATION. The last Potluck (April 30) where the CSA charged \$2.00 (not refunded) and provided one of the meat dishes - stuffed cabbage and after paying sales tax and the cost of the meat- \$139.60- a profit of \$5.50 was made. The reason was because only 73 people bought tickets.

The CSA also runs the Video Library/Box Office with a dedicated group of volunteers. The copy machine is leased and insured- all supplies are purchased for it and it is available for community use for FREE. The well stocked film library has been amassed by purchase and donation. Our monthly movie help provide the monies for the library as well as for the club that hosts it. But there are no hosts for June/July and August.

Clubs that put on events are also complaining because of the lack of participation- the "community" is not being supportive. Our Mother's/Father's Day Luncheon- catered by Bob Evans managed to sell 71 tickets. Besides the lovely food we were entertained by a magician-(anybody ever go to the Magic Moment restaurant on Siesta Key?) We didn't have to wait in line- didn't use gas and could arrive by golf cart. How can you go wrong?

The community has driven us to despair- we need you to participate and volunteer. If the CSA closes up shop- there will be no insurance available to cover any group unless they provide it on an individual activity basis. Limited monthly movies- no more coffees,potlucks, other monthly activities. Everybody would be on their own..Is this really what you want?

As I read the existing By-Laws- if the CSA doesn't sanction your activity- this is achieved by getting the date cleared through the CSA Social Director- you are not covered by insurance.

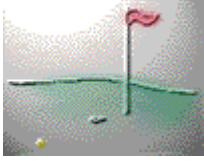
