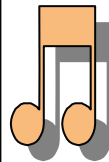

Many of our Snowbirds are on their way south and all of us are looking forward to welcoming them back after their summer "up north"...soon the roads will be getting busier, stores and restaurants are getting more crowded again. Please drive carefully, especially if you are driving a cart across 441 to the shopping center.

A few reminders: Security has been tying pink ribbons on unlit post lights. Usually, replacing the light bulb will fix it and you can check it by taping black electric tape over the photo cell and waiting a few seconds. If the light does not turn on automatically, the photo cell may need to be replaced. Parts are available at local hardware stores.

If your home is listed for sale with an outside realtor/broker, please remind them that the "For Sale" sign cannot be larger than 12" X 18 " and needs to be displayed in a window. Water Oak's rules don't allow "For Sale" signs to be placed in the ground. All realtors/brokers have a copy of our rules and have been notified that signs need to be changed if they are oversized.

Bought a new car? Please stop at the office to register your vehicle and get a new Resident ID sticker. When residents use the staffed side of the gate and their vehicle does not display a Resident ID sticker, Security may have to ask for other ID to verify that you are a resident. Our community has become too big to recognize everyone.

Are you planning to rent your home for the season? Ask Deborah to send a background check application to your prospective renters as soon as you can so that they can be approved before their arrival in Water Oak. As in prior years, you will be notified of your renter's approval and the gate will be notified of the arrival and departure date of each approved renter. If you have questions about the process, please call Deborah.

The 2011 rent notices were mailed a few days ago. If you have any questions regarding your notice, please feel free to stop at the office or give us a call. Although we have copies of the notices, it would be helpful if you could have your notice available to assist you more quickly. Also, there are a number of accounts carrying credit balances we would like to clear up before the start of the New Year. Please call or stop in to verify the total amount due before writing the next check.

Mark your calendars for October 15. Sun Homes is planning an Open House that day and we have combined it with a Cart Demonstration at the golf course, presented by The Villages Golf Carts, whose carts we have used on the golf course since January 2010. SECO is also planning to be here, sharing tips on energy conservation and energy efficiencies that many of

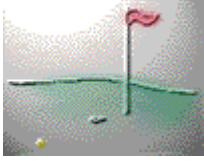

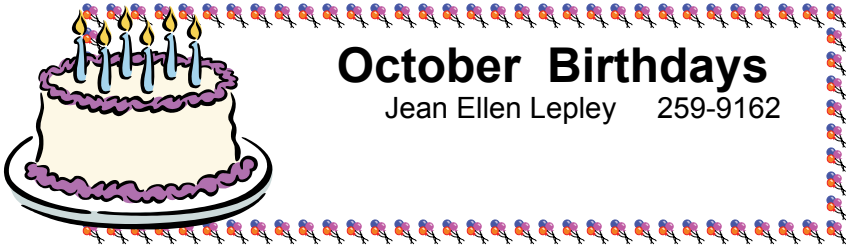
