Many residents who received notices in the past few months have already trimmed, edged, weeded, washed homes and in general improved their home site and the surrounding neighborhood. Improvements on other homes are still under way and some are on their second notices...Thanks to all of the home owners who have taken care of the items on the reminder notices. I know from experience how difficult it can be to take care of a home long distance. Some contractors promise but don't perform and we hear that you paid for a service and expected it to be done; sometimes other problems may have cropped up. Whether you are a year 'round resident or a snowbird, please be considerate of your neighbors. All of us deserve to live in a nice neighborhood all of the time.

By the way, if anyone needs help finding a contractor to assist you with sod replacement or weeding and edging or any number of "handyman" things, please call the office or stop in. You may find a contractor on the "Helping Hands" flyer. And, if you would like to be listed on the flyer, please let April know. Please also let her know if you have had a bad experience with someone. We'll remove their name from the list as soon as we hear about it.

Plants, shrubs and trees are an important part of the ecology as well as the Water Oak landscape. The University of Florida Extension Service in Tavares has a website that provides a lot of information, but if you are like most of us, "show and tell" is more fun. The Extension Service has a location in Tavares, staffed with knowledgeable friendly people including Master Gardeners and experts who love to share their passion with anyone who is interested. Please stop by their remodeled location just off HWY 19 in Tavares.

And also along the "nature" lines: Water Oak is not just home to humans but also to a variety of wildlife, from cats and dogs to our Sandhill Cranes, the Whistlers - black winged smallish water birds that actually whistle - as well as large turtles, at least one fox family, various possums and armadillos as well as a couple of cows that have jumped their fence at least twice on East Norman Street. Please be respectful of the wildlife (and the cows). Don't feed it or scare it and make sure that your pets are always on a leash or at home.

Driving the community, I have noticed a few roofs with rusted vents. All roofs should be inspected from time to time for vent stacks that may need to be resealed as well as general wear and tear. If you have a rusted vent cover, you want to replace it before it causes a leak, of course. Gutters need to be cleaned out to remain effective...growing weeds in

gutters indicates clogs that can lead to roof damage.

Notes from Security:

A pink ribbon on your post light indicates that it is not lighting up at night. Home Depot has sensors to replace a defective one, but you may want to start by replacing the light bulb first.

Security wants to thank everyone for dropping off their individual precalls in the mailbox at the gate and also wants to remind you that UPS, FedEx, the telephone and cable companies, flower delivery people, SECO and medical deliveries and other regulars do not have to be individually "precalled". If you expect a nurse or therapist for the first time, please let the gate know. Once they are on your list, they'll be able to get through the gate at any time.

And finally, if your email address is on file at the office, and you did not get an email from www.wateroak.com in August, it may be because you changed your email service or it may have been copied incorrectly. Check it out at the office, we'll be glad to make the necessary changes.

Connexion is the provider of communications equipment in Water Oak and it has selected Primecast to provide service vendor selection such as Direct TV, service ordering, service trouble reporting and service billing to residents. Connexion handles service problems for Primecast.

Current subscribers to DISH are not affected by the agreement with Primecast. New subscribers to DISH can enroll through Beyond Communications at 866-713-5182. CenturyLink customers who have DISH bundled with internet and telephone services are not affected. New CenturyLink Customers can still opt for Dish from Beyond Communications and then get their internet and telephone services from CenturyLink.

Primecast offers two assurance programs - the inside wiring plan for \$7.95 per month and the Equipment plan for \$7.95 per month. Both plans can be purchased at a discount price of \$9.95 per month. A single service call for either service or equipment may cost up to \$85.00 per service call.

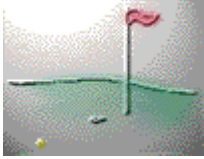
