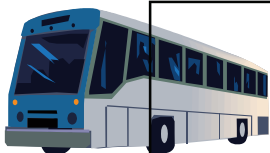

Some pretty good movies showed up this past month a long with a dud. "Flashbacks Of A Fool," starring Daniel Craig didn't really impress me. I didn't really see any redemption in it. Action thriller fans should enjoy "Linewatch," starring Cuba Gooding, Jr. who is a border patrol agent involved in border corruption. This one has redemption. Excuse me if I mention "A Lawless Street," a typical 50's B western with Randolph Scott. I couldn't resist it because a young Angela Lansbury plays his wife. "Blue State," deals with young idealists and their defection to Canada after candidate John Kerry lost the election. It reminded me of my young radical days when I didn't know any better but I never dreamed of defecting to make a political statement. "Heights," is a movie version of a New York stage play that deals with the life style of actors. You can take it or leave it. I'm tired of homosexuality being shoved in my face. "The Guys," is a moving story about a fire chief preparing to eulogize his fallen comrades after the 9-11 attack on the World Trade Center. Sigourney Weaver and Anthony LaPaglia star. "Stand and Deliver," starring Edward James Olmos is another great movie about a dedicated teacher leading his students to great educational achievements only to have the culture claim they must have cheated. This is a true story. Another movie inspired by actual events is "Nothing But The Truth," but this has a disclaimer that they have fictionalized the story. If you are at all familiar with the Valerie Plame case you will recognize what the fictionalizations are. However, this is still a great story. There are two intense movies in the group. "Things We Lost In the Fire," deals with grief, drugs and redemption. It stars Halle Berry and Benicio Del Toro and leaves you uplifted. "21 grams," on the other hand deals pretty much on the same kind of issues but is put together in what I think is a haphazard way. It is disjointed because the story is told in flashbacks and not necessarily in chronological order. It took me at least a quarter into it before I could figure out whose who and what's what. Again, I don't want to pan it because Benicio Del Toro and Naomi Watts do a superb job of acting. Sean Penn is Sean Penn. This is one of those pictures that seems to leave you hanging at the end. Now for the best of the bunch. There is always one or two that stand out over the others in the group. "Two Brothers," is such a movie. I defy anyone to tell me they didn't like it. It is for the whole family and animal lovers should love it. You will even want to look at the special features on this one.

One last accolade. "Dorf" featuring 8 classic episodes by Tim Conway mysteriously showed up in the video room. If you want to spend an evening laughing your head off this will do it for you.

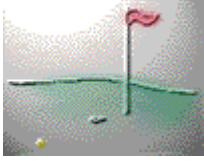
